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
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
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

The exhibition will be held from October 22nd to November 23rd, 2011. Reception on Saturday, October 22nd, 2011 from 1pm to 4pm.









The FCA participated with the Chinese Canadian Artists Federation in the 2nd Annual "Crossing Boundaries Show" which hung in their gallery this year. We sponsored four open juried shows: POTE, AIRS, Haiku Inspirations and the FCA 70th Anniversary Show. The final Gabriola Island workshop was held for the third successful year, and we thank all the friends we made at the beautiful Haven Resort. The Salt Spring Workshop 2012 is a program offered to continue the successful Island workshop experience that has proven to be very popular. The Salt Spring workshop format will divide the participating students into four groups, each spending a full day with each of the four featured instructors. This program will be based on en Plein Air painting at different scenic locations through out the Island. On the fifth day all the instructors will work with small groups and individuals, followed by an optional critique session.

Paint along side senior signature members of the Federation and join them for evening demo's and discussions.

Robert Genn, SFCA, will be a guest artist offering a day of individual critiques by request, first come first served.

Home base will be at ArtSpring, 100 Jackson Avenue in the town of Ganges. There will be other venues also but they are in or close to Ganges. We advise people booking accommodations to do so on the north end of the island - north of Cusheon Lake. This will greatly reduce driving times and facilitate getting to the evening events, and meals in restaurants. Participants with cars can easily stay outside of Ganges in one of the many of the B&Bs and cottage resorts. Those without vehicles can/should stay pretty close or in Ganges in one of the hotels.

ROBERT GENN CRITIQUES – Register your request for a time slot at fcaadmin@artists.ca. Bring up to 3 paintings or a cd or portfolio of your works completed before the Workshop. There will be a time limit of 15 minutes per person so bring the work you want input on. Critique can range from paintings, portfolios and comments on career development.

PLEIN AIR participants generally work in the medium in which they are most comfortable. They may work in one medium all week, or they are certainly free to switch and try something different depending upon the instructor of the day. Supply lists will be provided soon for each presenter. The main idea is to understand how each instructor goes about developing a good painting outdoors. This will depend on the medium to some extent, but it will also expose the participants to the instructor's ideas on composition, simplification and approach to the art of plein air painting, distinct from studio painting.

MEDIUMS – It is important that whichever medium or mediums participants plan to use, they should prepare a portable field painting kit which they can carry to the painting site. While we will try to minimize the amount of walking, some is inevitable. So if participants plan on using more than one medium, the supplies should be organized into separate kits that are portable. Carrying several painting mediums in one kit is not recommended (too heavy and cumbersome).

LIFE DRAWING **ARTIST TIP**

Drawing from life is really key to becoming a better artist. To me it's a basic fundamental that too often gets neglected. It's like not knowing the words of a song before you sing it.

When life drawing I prefer using a craft paper pad (only \$6). It works really well with pastels, charcoal, conte, ink, and acrylics. I start with a few two and five minute poses to warm up and then work up to 10, 15, 20, and 30 minute poses. If I am painting however, it is nice to have half the day to push the paint around.







BEHIND THE EASEL



with Robert Genn, SFCA

BE YOUR OWN **BEST CRITIC**

Yesterday Michelle Lonsdale wrote, "I'm currently in my second year studying Fine Arts at a University. I'm working on a research assignment investigating artists' self-critiquing methods. What thoughts, beliefs or rituals do you use ing them in museums magically transfers while critiquing your work?"

Thanks, Michelle. Your question is such a valuable one. With all the current running off to get things juried and critiqued by others, self-critiquing might seem an unpopular sport. It isn't. The

acquired ability to self-critique is the fuse of great art and the silver bullet of the pros. While all artists work differently, here are a few thoughts:

Quality develops when the artist and the critic are honed into a functioning coop within the same skull. The "ritual" is to pry the artist away from the critic. The artist can be flamboyant, egocentric and prejudiced. The critic needs to be patient, humble and strict. A split personality may be the price you have to pay to see your work through fresh, unsullied eyes. The operation doesn't hurt--much.

Divorcing yourself from the preciousness of your efforts and seeing your work as it really is takes time and mileage. This means "alone time" in your working area. A valuable ploy is to constantly upgrade and rethink standards of excellence. This is most often done through books and other media. This doesn't mean your style will be influenced by the exposure, but rather you may improve by association with those you admire. "You're only as good as the company you keep," goes the time-honoured expression. The mere act of holding onto great works or seea sense of timelessness and creative soul. Fact is, you will not generally improve by misguided staring at your own efforts.

Not surprisingly, when you switch from creation mode to critique mode, you tend to lose the magic of inspiration and substitute a more pedestrian, mechanical approach. A checklist is valuable. In serious sobriety you need to write and follow your own list. Right now I'm using a series of varying questions: Meaningful subject? Strong patterns? Middle tones? Interlocking gradations? General gradations? Echoing shapes? Flowing design? Alluring counterpoint? Lost and found? Focal point? Big and small? Overall simplicity? Complex shapes? Visual depth? Interesting surface? Arial perspective? Sophisticated colour? Natural believability? Dramatic event? What could be?

Critical intuition can also be enhanced by minor substance abuse. Cigars and Scotch have been my traditional choices. Since giving up smoking I've begun to note the critical value of alcohol. "In vino veritas" (In wine there is truth), said Plato. More recently, I've been stalking errors by merely putting on another hat. Right now I'm using an Australian Akubra that makes me feel like an antipodean crocodile wrestler. On and off it goes, sometimes several times an hour.

FIXING A DRAWING ON CANVAS

recently complicated acrylic canvas. be painting acrylics but have noticed that prior to starting the drawing is already

starting to smear. What can I put on as fixative to preserve the drawing? Would the same fixative work for oils? I have been to the local art supply store and after reading all the labels. I am still no wiser! Thanks so

Hi Gloria.

Preparatory drawings on canvas or board, whether they are done in pencil or ink, do need to be fixed before you can start the painting. Some painters avoid this issue by simply sketching out their image with the paint. But of course this isn't practical for all painting styles. All dye based ink markers will bleed, I use acrylic inks or India Ink for these drawings on the gesso and they will not smudge easily or bleed once they

I don't know if the spray type fixatives in the art store would be of any use in this situation. I have very little experience or information on these products. Even if they did act as a fixative for the drawing I wonder Good luck, David

how compatible they would be with the paint layers as they are not meant to be painted over, as a rule.

I do know that pencil is simply graphite and it will smear when you rub it with a paint brush. You can fix it before starting your acrylic painting by first applying a layer of acrylic medium, however. The key is to apply a generous layer and spread it very lightly with a soft brush so as not to disturb the pencil drawing. When the medium is dry, the drawing will be set and you can begin painting. I have done this successfully many

The same method would work for oils except that you would replace the acrylic medium for an oil one of course. Adding color to this sizing layer that seals the drawing is an age old practice and this first glaze laver is called an "Imprimatura".

WHY TAKE A WORKSHOP?

I have learned something valuable from every instructor I have met. The artist-instructors are a clever group of people with a vast array of knowledge to share. If you have the time and the resources to tap into that knowledge, go for it. If you feel the need to get out of your studio, meet new people and freshen up your work sign up for a course!


