
"Making it! Case studies of Successful Canadian Visual Artists" gives inspiration by exploring the professional experiences of a variety of artists through interviews and panel discussions.

# How Not to Frame

#### BY MILA KOSTIC

As a Gallery Director I see a lot of paintings come through our doors. Usually I look at sixty to eighty painting entries for each exhibition with two exhibitions every month.

The purpose of this article is to open a discussion about how to present your work to its best advantage. In the next few issues we can discuss how to mat your work, submit your work to the juried shows and how to price your work. There are a lot of topics to cover; let's approach them with a sense of humour and perhaps some personal stories along the way.

It is a new experience for me to share my opinions with all of you. It has been part of my personal struggle as an immigrant to have my voice heard, as it is, I'm sure, for you as an artist.

Let's call this discussion "How Not to Frame". I would like you as artists, to send me your ideas, suggestions and comments from what you see at the gallery – focus on frames only please – it could be a great learning opportunity for all of us. For the last four years I have seen every mistake made: from fancy, over-the-top gold frames, that could 'kill' any decent painting, to very unusual choices for mats. A frame will not make a bad painting look good. If your painting is weak, there is no frame in the world that will make it look like a masterpiece. But if your painting has some artistic merit, a frame can definitely enhance its features, that is, if it is well chosen.

You can have the most amazing painting ready to exhibit. However, framed incorrectly, your painting may not look as impressive as you hoped.

Sure, we've all seen art exhibitions with the 'minimalist' approach, where artists purposely show off their masterpieces in unframed canvases. There are many instances where this can work, but many paintings look more professional when appropriately framed.

Let's begin. You can send your opinion or comment to the fcagallery@artists.ca or in the form of old fashion letter with your opinions and impressions about framing. I will respond to some of your comments in the next issue of Art Avenue and include a few of my own insights as well.

# THE TELEBUDDY SYSTEM

Did you ever notice when you're driving a car over familiar territory you can fail to notice high-profile landmarks such as tunnels, bridges or bypasses? Distracted by the car radio, fantasy, or in-car conversation, the miles can wind by in blind oblivion.

On the other hand, truly alert and engaged driving is often reserved for new territory. Around-the-corner surprises make the trip more interesting.

Something similar happens at the easel.

While creativity depends on curiosity and discovery, the expression of art also benefits from some form of mild distraction.

We're all familiar with the value of music, discs, audio-books and radio. With benefit of speakerphone or headset, some painters spend time on the telephone. Some others encourage studio companions--often family or fellow travelers. Even a studio assistant, bookkeeper, canvas primer or a non-vacuuming cleaner-upper is a welcome presence in many studios.

During some periods of high easel activity, the Southwest painter R.C. Gorman was reported to have employed a footmasseuse.

I'm pioneering the "painting telebuddy system. I'm wondering if it could be done in groups. Two or more artists agree to work together over the phone or by Skype. In the telephone version, wide ranging back-and-forth conversations sets the creative brain into a kind of soporific free flow. Generally a specific time frame is chosen. Amazing things can be accomplished together over the phone in one hour. Skype has the added feature of pleasant, companionable periods of dead air, which may or may not be beneficial.

Requirements of the telebuddy system include the avoidance of tough questions. Right-brain free-flow creativity is

made more effective with the benefit of gossip, anecdote, or amusement. Creative questions and answers need to snake automatically through the neural ganglia. Sharing can be done later by jpeg.

Quality art cannot be made completely in the automatic zone. That's why, when the phone is hung up or the Skype is closed down, you need to drive down that road again as if you are in new territory. Fact is, you really need to become fully alert at least several times in the production of every work. That's just another reason to go down several roads at the same time.

Regarding studio companions, many among our membership opt to get together in one another's studio once a week. One such group calls themselves 'Masterpiece Tuesdays.' Between two and five regularly show up. There is no agenda. Members just paint. Some talk, some listen. From time to time they have casual critiques. Perhaps the presence of other bodies spurs the brush and provides distraction enough. "The creation of art," said Saul Bellow, "has something to do with an arrest of attention in the midst of distraction."

# PEACE RIVER CHAPTER OF THE FEDERATION OF CANADIAN ARTISTS

#### NEW BEGINNINGS FOR A NEW CHAPTER

Nestled in the heart of northeastern B.C. and northwestern Alberta, the newest chapter of the Federation of Canadian Artists, the Peace River Chapter (PRFCA) held the opening of its inaugural art show, "New Beginnings", on May 14th in Dawson Creek. The chapter started out with 34 members and gained seven new members over the weekend. Members reside in an array of communities around the Peace River region.

"It was an honour that there were enough artists juried in to the Federation to enable us to form a chapter in the Peace Region last year," said PRFCA President, Sandy Troudt. Part of that success was likely due to the varied media preference of its members who work in a wide variety of media including watercolours, acrylics, oils, encaustics, printmaking processes, mixed media and drawing. Sandy explained that communities in the Peace Region already have a strong art presence, but area artists wanted to strive for more. "With such a variety of communities in the area, local groups have been providing support and educational opportunities for practicing artists," explained Troudt. "Part of the reason for joining the FCA was to extend those connections to other artists. Artists throughout the region want to continue learning and attaining excellence in a field that we love. We're looking forward to opportunities for continued growth through the many resources offered by the Federation."

Associate Member of the FCA and a juror of "New Beginnings", Marney-Rose Edge, attended the PRFCA's inaugural show. She said the quality of the work created by Chapter members made it tough to pick the prize winners. "It was easy to pick first, second and third, and then it starts to get more difficult with so many great pieces." Marney also complimented the Dawson Creek Art Gallery, a former grain elevator with a unique ramp system along the walls of the annex that provides 200 linear feet of hanging space. "This gallery is something else," said Marney, "It really is, and it's great that the whole community comes together to support them."

With the success of "New Beginnings", Marney predicted that the PRFCA will go far.

"I think they'll do very, very well. They're very innovative and progressive. They have a wide age range within their membership," she said. "They're such a wonderful group of people. I've enjoyed this trip very much."

David, I have a question... it would be wonderful if you had a solution/suggestion! I drew on a canvas with biro pen (it was a quick thing and I wasn't thinking!),

I proceeded however with the painting until it was finished.... but no matter how many layers of acrylic I put on the pen is still showing through...I'm trying to paint in white as well which doesn't help matters! Would emulsion paint work?? Thanks, Ros

that is suitable for using under paint is India ink, or acrylic inks which are pigment/ particle based so that they stay put once they are dry.

Work must retain semblance to reality while maintaining the subjective interpretation of the artist. It is open to all living artists worldwide.

Artwork must be submitted with a conventional hanging device attached and the work must be framed or prepared in a professional way for display in the gallery. Unframed canvases must have all sides wrapped in canvas with no staples showing. The FCA reserves the right of refusal to hang any artwork that is deemed to be not suitably prepared. It is understood by the applicant of any show submission that the FCA abides by the Canadian Copyright laws and therefore all work must be declared to be the original work of the submitting artist. No artwork will be accepted that is found to be a copy or derivative of another artist's work, nor can works produced in class or workshops be submitted. All paintings submitted and accepted into a juried show must be for sale in order to hang in the gallery. The gallery will take a 35% commission on all sales. Your HST number should be made available to the office. The FCA has limited insurance coverage, and while it is the priority to ensure the safety of paintings held in the gallery, the FCA cannot take responsibility for any damage or loss incurred during the time the work is in transit to or from the gallery or while in the gallery. Artists submitting work for exhibition in the gallery must agree to allow the FCA publishing privileges of that work.
