

DIRECTOR'S COMMUNIQUÉ



Though most of us have isolated ourselves at home in the last few months. it was definitely not the time for the Federation to stand still. Staying the course would have been disastrous for the FCA, as it has been for many arts organizations throughout Canada and beyond. It was time to pivot our operation.

During March and April, while the situation was very ... shall we say "dynamic"? we pulled back and played it very conservatively. Expecting the worst, I cancelled our education programs, Art Avenue, and laid off nearly all staff. I knew we would be facing a prolonged lockdown and that we would need to make huge changes to how the Federation operates. But beyond that, we just didn't know what to expect.

What I didn't know is whether the changes we could make would make enough of a difference. While our government has repeatedly announced programs to help businesses and non-profits, we have yet to receive significant help. It's been up to staff to make sure that the Federation made its way through COVID and the resulting financial crisis.

By July I could see the starts of success of our new business model, and by August it was becoming clear that it was working. While we're still far from recovering, we know we're on the right track.

While Helen has the first half of the 2021 exhibitions already online, she has also been helping a record number of Chapters with their exhibition calls. For local Vancouver members, she's working on the Holiday Art Market, and working together with Tarin on the pop-up gallery space we recently acquired near the Granville Island Market.

Katrin has been working hard on developing our online

education programs including introductory and advanced mentorship programs, workshops on pricing and documenting artwork and prep for applying for Signature status. We've set up a small video recording studio and can now record workshops and soon will also be able host them live.

Tarin has focussed on bringing our sales, which have traditionally taken place in our brick-and-mortar gallery, to our online resources. She attended (and graduated from) a 10week course on making effective use of social media and has had great success. While my hopes were that she could maintain the sales level we had last year, Tarin has managed to shoot beyond them. The sales team sold 20% more this year than last! A huge accomplishment, especially seeing that year over year, we'd already been making increases.

As we are entering membership renewal season, I'd like to introduce the newest member of our team; Tessa, our Membership & Studio Coordinator. Her office is in the new studio and education space we acquired next door to the gallery. While COVID has made it an awkward time to expand our operations, the needs of our members has never been greater.

Although our troubles are far from over, I feel great confidence in our future. As we begin our 80th year in operation in a couple of months, I'd like to start dreaming big again. The brilliant artists who came together in Kingston in 1941 and decided to start the Federation of Canadian Artists were dreaming big. So can we.

MY PERSONAL **CONNECTION WITH** LAWREN HARRIS

As told by Kathleen Bragg Murphy

Editor's Note: The Federation of Canadian Artists was created as a society in 1941 by the Group of Seven artists including Lawren Stewart Harris (October 23, 1885 – January 29, 1970) who became organizer of the FCA's West Coast region after his move from Ontario to BC. During his lengthy career, Harris visited Newfoundland on various occasions to paint its dramatic, rugged landscape and iconic East Coast buildings. In honour of the Group of Seven's 100th Anniversary, the following personal account discusses the prolific artist.

Frank Bragg worked at Government House in St. John's, Newfoundland in 1967. During a Christmas social, Frank approached then Lieutenant Governor Fabian O'Dea, exclaiming that, unbeknownst to him, the painting image chosen for the official Government House Christmas card that year depicted his own house. The original landscape painting "Quidi Vidi Gut" by Lawren Harris was one of Mr. O'Dea's prized purchases, and his Honour was excited to hear about the connection, reiterating this story whenever he showed anyone the painting.

Frank's daughter, FCA member and artist Kathleen Bragg Murphy was born and raised in Quidi Vidi Village, and lived in the house depicted in the famous painting from March 1953 to November 1973. She understands why Harris would have chosen to paint the setting with its picturesque Newfoundland landscape that showed a family home overlooking the harbour, Quidi Vidi Gut, and the rugged coastline leading to the North Atlantic Ocean.

Kathleen remembers her father bringing home the prized Christmas card when she was a child, and many years later often wondered if she could find a copy of it. She was told that it would be like finding a needle in a haystack. However, last fall she became determined to track down the card.

Although Kathleen was unsuccessful in her initial searches, while at The Rooms Provincial Archives, by coincidence a woman overheard her enquiry about the card. She suggested that Kathleen contact the former Lt. Governor's family and kindly offered her own contact information. (Kathleen discovered later that the woman was the granddaughter of JR Smallwood, former premier of Newfoundland.) Although the O'Dea family first told Kathleen the Christmas card was not kept, weeks later, she was thrilled to learn that, after searching a storage box kept by the family, the missing card was found! She also learned that the original 13" x 10" Lawren Harris oil on board is now part of a private collection within her province.

"When I look at the photo of the original Harris painting, I find it warm and welcoming," she said. She is also very familiar with the exact location behind her house from where Harris painted the landscape, likely en plein air. As a painter, Kathleen is inspired by landscapes and seascapes similar to those that influenced Lawren Harris.

During pop-up artist painting events at The Quidi Vidi Village Plantation last summer, Kathleen observed how much the village had been developed through time and modernization.

She felt inspired to create a series of 12 comparative acrylic paintings, 12" x 16", displaying images of Quidi Vidi Village from circa 1850s/1900s

to current time. Half of the series is painted in black and white from reference photos and the remaining half is painted in colour, referencing modernization. Her series also features a painting of the same house and another landscape that was painted by Lawren Harris. Both are included in her current exhibition.



It feels 'surreal' that I have a picture of the famous Christmas card on display next to the photo of the Harris painting and my own painting of the house that I grew up in."

Kathleen was successful in her funding application for this painting project, and she gratefully acknowledges the support of ArtsNL Newfoundland and Labrador Arts Council.
