

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

A DIRECTOR'S COMMUNIQUÉ



First, I would like to congratulate us all on the advent of our 80th anniversary year. It was in June of 1941 that artists, museum directors and art historians from all regions of Canada gathered at Queen's University campus in Kingston, Ontario. For days they engaged in lively discussions about everything from the role of the arts in Canadian society to technical con-

cerns of the painter. It had been the first time artists from across Canada had ever met together, and participants wanted to create a bond that would allow further discussion and cooperation.

On the evening before the conference participants moved on to Ottawa to visit the National Gallery, Jack Shadbolt chaired a resolution session where the conference agreed to elect a Continuation Committee of five members; Walter Abell, AY Jackson, Arthur Lismer and Frances Loring, presided over by André Biéler. The continuation committee went on to form a continuing national organization by the name of the "Federation of Canadian Artists"; along with numerous regional chapters, and hiring of a national secretary.

We've had good times and bad since then, but we keep moving forward because our vision is still clear. The arts are very much part of the society we wish to live in and the Federation is an opportunity for artists and art appreciators to band together and make visual arts a more integral part of Canadian culture.

To know where we are going, it is helpful to know where we have come from. So, every January I revisit our founding documents and the reports of the preceding year. This time of year always causes a bit of psychological whiplash as I look back at the year that just passed and look forward to complete the plans for the year to come. As I review the reports that summarize last year, it is hard to imagine how we managed to navigate it all. Luckily it's still fresh enough in my memory that I can recall it in detail. And what a year 2020 was.

Last year, for example, we refunded everyone their registration

money for the Plein Air Painting Retreat at the Flying U due to the pandemic we still find ourselves in. The good news is that the coming retreat, planned for this coming September, looks like it will be able to go ahead. Between the vaccine and the COVID protocol that The Flying U has put in place for us, I feel confident in the safety of proceeding with our beloved retreat this year. You can feel confident in the fact that if we need to cancel again due to a similar unforeseen issue, we'll provide full refunds again.

Members founded our 14th Chapter in Edmonton this last year. The Federation's Edmonton Chapter has already been busy at work, as you will see in our feature article in this issue. I'd love to see the start of another new Chapter in 2021. A Chapter in the Maritimes would be brilliant. Perhaps Montreal, Ottawa, Winnipeg or even Vancouver? Yes, Vancouver still doesn't have a Chapter, believe it or not. If you live in an area without a Chapter and you'd like to help form one, please contact our Membership Coordinator at membership@artists.ca.

2020 saw the start of adding sculpture to the list of officially accepted art forms within the Federation. The Federation Gallery hosted the first two official sculpture exhibitions in nearly 3 decades—and it looked fantastic. Moreover, there were sales! Sculpture sales added to the painting sales to give us our highest sales year on record, despite our months-long shut down.

While our education program progressed more slowly due to COVID-19 than I care for, considering the plans we had in store, we are moving in the right direction now. With the addition of our education space next to the gallery, we built a small temporary film studio and are now set to record workshops, and eventually to host workshops live, online. We started hosting online workshops last fall, and will continue building the education program, available to all members across Canada.


9. INTERNATIONAL ARTIST MAGAZINE


EDMONTON EXTENDS ITS CREATIVE REACH

EDMONTON'S THRIVING ARTS **COMMUNITY IGNITES 14TH** FCA CHAPTER

In 2018, when artist Barbra Regamey McDonald and her husband moved from Vancouver Island to Edmonton, Alberta to be closer to family, she knew she was leaving something special behind. Being an Active member of the Federation affiliated to the Arrowsmith Chapter, she had become accustomed to the personal interaction with professional artists within its membership and the creativity that they challenged and inspired within her.


Barbra quickly found, however, that Edmonton and surrounding area offer a vibrant and thriving artist community. Yet when she investigated the many established organizations in this creative mecca, she found none offered the level of artistic challenge that a FCA Chapter would provide.

CHAPTER LAUNCH

Barbra approached the Federation's Vancouver head office about the possibility of a new chapter. She organized a meeting in her home with artists in the area to discuss possibilities. Although interest and enthusiasm was great, the number of Active FCA artist members needed to meet the quota for chapter status was not.

Joyce Boyer, who had many contacts in the arts community, heard the chatter and contacted Barbra. A meeting with other interested artists was arranged, and among those attending was FCA Signature member **Cindy Revell**, SFCA. When Barbra discovered that Cindy was able to jury, a very real opportunity arose, and a membership drive was organized.

With the addition of Doris Charest, AFCA, jurying took place in November, 2019, where an additional 18 artists successfully earned their Active Status, joining previous Active and Signature FCA artists. This enabled the Chapter to qualify and move forward. In February, 2020, the Edmonton FCA Chapter held its founding meeting with 25 Active and Signature members, and the next day, the application for Chapter status was approved. The Chapter covers Edmonton, extending north to Morinville, east to Sherwood Park and Cooking Lake, south to Leduc and west to Stony Plain and Spruce Grove.

Once the Chapter was established, several things had to be accomplished and many artists volunteered to get things moving. Chapter affiliate Rick Rogers along with Crystal Driedger, Cam Wilson and Carleen Ross created and launched the website, www.fcaedmonton. Having savvy social media volunteers within the group has been of great benefit to the new Chapter. During this time, the unexpected happened and the Edmonton Chapter, like the rest of the world, found itself in a pandemic, but it did not lose its momentum, and continued to move forward in spite of it.

EDMONTON MEMBERS

As soon as the Chapter formed, many of its new affiliates started submitting work for various sanctioned Federation Gallery exhibitions held in Vancouver. Almost every exhibition since March had Edmonton members represented, and over 10 submissions won awards at those same shows. They include Jori Warren, 1st Place, "Retro," Cindy Revell, SFCA, 2nd Place "365 Calendar Project," Renee Lippa, 3rd Place, "Works on

The Edmonton Chapter consists of an exciting mix of eclectic artists with diverse styles and genres. Many affiliates are award winning artists whose work appears in galleries and public art collections internationally. These members include Anne McCartney, Karen Bishop, Karen Blanchet, and Judy Schafers.

Marg Klappstein, Show Committee Chair took the reins to organize the first Chapter exhibition, which had to be staged online due to the pandemic. FCA head office hosted the Chapter exhibition on the Federation website www.artists.ca, which ran during October and November. Marg and her team are now planning the Spring Show taking place in February.

The Edmonton Chapter affiliates represented in this article are not only excellent artists, but amazing volunteers. Without volunteers, there would be no Chapter, and for that reason we offer them as many benefits as possible: plein air painting sessions, free online critiques and information sessions have been organized. Volunteers, in addition to FCA Award Winners, are recognized for their contributions on two revolving slide shows on our website home page that change regularly.


EDMONTON CHAPTER MANDATE




