

### DIRECTOR'S COMMUNIQUÉ



As many of you know, the Federation went through a transition about 6 years ago from a "managing board" to a "governance board." Before that time, our Board of Directors performed much of the management functions necessary for the operation of the Federation like FCA Chapter Boards do. Assisted by staff, the board was directly involved in daily duties.

The transition to a governance model was revolutionary for the Federation, allowing us to grow in size and breadth. We were no longer limited by the volunteer hours that the Board members could contribute, instead drawing on paid staff to create and manage more programs to provide much-needed services that members were asking for. The Executive Director (yup, me) was made responsible for getting the work done, and I then manage the team of staff I've placed in charge of the various programs we offer.

I'm making a point to outline this because the Federation is a membership organization so you are entitled to know how the organization you belong to functions. The Board still acts on your behalf to reach a collective vision, focusing on "big picture" financial planning, not budget sheets, and the direction of the organization, not how we get there.



Since Board members take their jobs and responsibilities very seriously, they have been convening with key members of staff since late 2019 to discuss a new Strategic Plan. With COVID sidelining us last year, it took longer than expected. But I believe we now have the makings of a great Strategic Plan for the Federation. The entire document is now complete and is available on our website: https://artists.ca/about/governance. Based on our longstanding vision and our 80 years of history, this plan is both firmly rooted and boldly visionary. It is exciting to be a key team member in an organization focused on excellence, gearing up for continued sustainable growth, and dedicated to providing services for artists throughout Canada.

I believe that our founders would be proud of the work we do. I'm certainly proud of what we've completed to date. If you are curious about where the Federation plans to go over the coming years, I'd recommend reading the Strategic Plan. I'd also recommend that you attend the Annual General Meeting. This year it will be taking place on Zoom, the afternoon/evening of Sunday July 25th. Please register for it online (Registration link on our artists.ca homepage, button at right side of the page titled "AGM Registration") and you will receive a link to attend the meeting, available to members only.







One day while field-sketching, he was sitting in his car, stuck for ideas, when suddenly he looked at the rain on his windshield, and saw how it molded and shaped forms and light. Up until then, he'd struggled to capture realism of forms, but then remembered what

Casson Medal in 2006. **INSPIRATION:** I find inspiration in the effects of light on objects, whether mountain, cathedral or glass. Light transforms perception and is key to expression and narrative. Transforming a blank piece paper into a 3-dimensional world with fairly simple tools never loses its allure and joy. Travel and backcountry adventures directly influence my subject matter, artistic choices and aesthetic. Principal genres — architecture, landscape, still life. >BACKGROUND: I have been a full-time painter since receiving a Bachelor of Fine Arts from University of Alberta in 1989. I became a

ARTIST: 15 ► HIGHLIGHT: A collector who purchased 22 of my paintings dedicated a room in their home to my work. ► INSPIRATION: As a still life painter, I'm inspired by light and shadow, how it turns form and creates drama and beauty. Painting in oils helps me achieve the soft and lost edges that create visual mystery. ► BACKGROUND: I have loved drawing and painting throughout my life, and at age 12 enjoyed plein air painting during summer vacation. In high school, I studied drawing, painting, sculpture, ceramics, weaving, print making. 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



### 5. IN MEMORIAM: DAN VARNALS, SFCA


