Remembering Grant McLean, SFCA

Grant McLean, upon receiving his SFCA status in 2009, wrote of himself in Art Avenue that he had been exhibiting in juried venues with the FCA since 1977, the year my physiotherapy career began. The Right" and Left halves of my brain have been duking it out ever since". The humour and insight are there in Grant's statement - what isn't there is the acknowledgement that these two seemingly opposing intelligences were so compellingly unified and integrated in one remarkable man. That appreciation is for his family, his many friends and for his art colleagues who have had the privilege to have been a part of Grant's life.

Grant passed away on January 15, 2011 at the age of fifty-six. He lived in Abbotsford with his wife Carol and their three daughters, practiced physiotherapy in Langley and painted with great passion far and wide, When he took ill, he was enjoying a much-looked-forward-to family holiday in Ireland, exploring his roots and gathering inspiration and imagery for his Ireland series of paintings.


Some of us in the art community were also fortunate enough to have known Grant in his professional capacity as a physiotherapist, where he brilliantly blended his Right and Left halves. Explanations of physical conditions and their remedies were always made logical and crystal clear by his particular ability to create imaginative metaphors. The artist spoke through the physiotherapist, and as a result, everything always seemed more reasonable and more full of promise. We could always expect just the right mix of forthrightness and sensitivity from Grant, whether he was presenting our treatment plans or critiquing our art. Woven throughout any encounter with him was his fabulous sense of humour. It could be subtle, it could be silly, and it was always well-aimed and well-timed.

Grant brought both energy and a meticulous attention to detail to all aspects of his life, and in his art he always worked to get it right. That is the way he saw the world. His commitment to a clear, well-planned artistic statement in every art piece was evident from his earliest pen and inks through to his fresh, vibrant watercolours and on to his rich acrylic landscapes. The precision and complexity of the piers in the White Rock series and the accurate perspective of the poles and wires in "Mt. Cheam - Late Summer" illustrate his understanding the need for strong compositions in his paintings. When these elements were fused with his masterful application of colour the results were remarkable and unforgettable. We are fortunate to have the legacy of his fine work.


When Grant was able to resume painting this past year, he placed a simple note to himself in his studio stating that he would paint every day to the best of his abilities. He did this as he always had done, with great purpose and determination. Grant meant so much to so many people. A man of strong faith in family and community, he was serious and playful, direct and gentle, decisive and thoughtful. Grant's outstanding character and exceptional art are an inspiration to all of us whose lives he touched. He will be greatly missed but never forgotten.

Trish Armstrong-Gibson, AFCA was a finalist for the Mayor's Gala for the Arts Award. The award category this year is Leadership in the Arts.


Veronica Funk's interior paintings have been featured in International Contemporary Artists.

The painters depicted by John Singer Sargent in his 1913 painting seem unaware of the social and political changes that were beginning only a year later. The 1st World War produced unprecedented social change and radical changes in Art.

Plein Air painting truly began in the 1840's with the invention of the paint tube. This convenience made it possible for artists to transport their painting tools and set up their studio in nature. The fleeting outdoor light gave birth to the impressionistic style. Painters like Sisley, Morisott, Monet and Renoir were dedicated proponents of painting outdoors. The styles they developed owing much to this way of working. Plein Air painting is letting the senses be filled with the beauty of the place and allowing the painting to flow from the environment through the brush to the canvas. It's about daring to truly see and experience what is surrounding you.







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pring is coming and along with the new life and garden clippings we get clipped for income taxes. Many professional artists avail themselves of the services of a qualified income tax preparer and/or financial advisor. There are some rugged individuals who do it themselves and while these comments are intended for them they may be of use to the others in providing data/questions to their advisors.

For those who want to be more informed on the matter of income taxes here are some websites that provide guidance:

Canada Revenue Agency

http://www.cra-arc.gc.ca/formspubs/menu-eng.html - this is the lead site for all things taxation in Canada, tax packages, forms, publications and documents.

Guide for Canadian Small Business

http://www.cra-arc.gc.ca/E/pub/tg/rc4070/rc4070-09e.pdf - this is full of information for individuals operating a small business, as an artist is.

Business Number/HST Account Registration

http://www.cra-arc.gc.ca/E/pbg/tf/rc1a/rc1a-10e.pdf to register for HST. This will likely be of advantage to an artist operating as a business. There is a "small business exemption" explained on Page 11 of the following publication.

The Business Number and Your Canada Revenue Agency Accounts

http://www.cra-arc.gc.ca/E/pub/tg/rc2/rc2-10e.pdf - This elaborates on the registration process and, on Page 11, sets out the criteria under which it is not necessary to register for HST (at which point it is optional but is almost certain to be of advantage to the artist selling their artworks).

Interpretation Bulletin IT-504R2, Visual Artists and Writers

http://www.cra-arc.gc.ca/E/pub/tp/it504r2-consolid-e.pdf - This bulletin sets out the Canada Revenue Agency interpretation of the rules as applied to visual artists. It is not law but is a guideline to avoid conflict with their interpretation of the rules. It does not appear to have been revised to reflect more recent court cases which found that the "Reasonable Expectation of Profit" test is "a factor to be considered" but "it is not the only factor, nor is it conclusive." The overall question is "whether or not the taxpayer carrying on the activity in a commercial manner". (search Arseneault V. The Queen, 2006 TCC 42)

Artist Survivor Skills

http://christyrell.ca/books - Available at Opus, Chapters/Indigo and Sand Hill. This is a must have reference book for any artist in business and Chapter 12, "Tax Considerations for Artists", covers just that, extensively.

I hope this information helps you through the income tax jungle. If you find yourself in need of a guide, look for a qualified tax advisor.

I have dismantled an older oil painting of mine from its broken frame. Before I stretch the painting on a new canvas frame, is it a good idea to add another coat of gesso to the back of the painting? The reason I am considering this step is that it seems that oil has seeped through the back perhaps because the canvas had not been thick enough or not enough gesso had been applied.

I am worried about the life of the painting if I don't restore it somehow. The front of the painting (the oil) seems also dry and rather brittle, like paper. So I am considering adding a layer or more of Galkyd over it. Do you have any suggestions to restore the whole painting to ensure longevity? Thanks for your help, Tom

Hi Tom,

That is a tricky task you are undertaking. How much the painting is worth, to you at least, should be considered before proceeding. The kinds of things you are proposing are delicate and risky operations. The safe alternative to any intervention would be to simply frame the entire piece, minus the frame, under glass so that no oxygen can come into contact with it. That is how many valuable but fragile paintings are preserved in museums.

The symptoms you describe, oil seeping to the back of the canvas and a dry, brittle surface, are common problems of oil paintings done over a thin absorbent gesso layer on thin, commercial cotton canvas like the ones you get at art supply stores. These canvases are not good for permanent oil painting.

If you feel comfortable going ahead with any operations I would first apply a coat of a good quality alkyd medium, like the Galkyd you suggest, over the painting and let it dry. This will definitely help preserve the painting by imparting some flexibility and stability. It is too bad you did not do that before removing the painting from the stretcher bars.

Then I would apply a coat of Golden GAC 400 medium on the back of the canvas, not gesso. The GAC 400 is a specially formulated medium that is a fabric stiffener. It will tighten the canvas and 'plasticize' it making it less prone to movement due to fluctuations in temperature and humidity as well as imparting flexibility and durability to the fabric which has clearly become brittle and fragile due to the oil it has absorbed.

The problem with this procedure is that the medium has water in it which will seep through and can cause a softening of the gesso and separation of the oil paint from the ground (gesso). This is why it is important to apply the alkyd medium over the painted surface first. I have successfully done this however by applying the GAC 400 medium in a very warm room with fans blowing on the back surface as I brush it on to hasten drying so that very little of the water has time to seep through to the gesso layer and evaporates quickly instead.

When restretching the canvas, do so carefully and gradually, using even pressure to pull with the canvas pliers, starting from the middle sections and moving out to the edges by no more than two staples at a time in each direction.

The FCA will take the utmost care in handling works submitted but cannot accept responsibility for loss or damage to paintings, frames or packing crates. A 35% commission will be deducted from the selling price in the event of a sale. Please advise the Office if you are GST registered. Artists submitting work agree to allow their images to be published in Art Avenue or in FCA advertising. Consent is given by the artists through the act of submitting. The FCA does not pay for shipping.
