

#### VICTORIA CHAPTER by Alan Mark Cross





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### HOW SHOULD I FRAME MY ARTWORK?

#### MATTING:

How long do I want my artwork to last? Poster, print, or original, each artwork requires its own special care. Mats create an aesthetic surrounding for your artwork, but more importantly, mats create an air space between your art and covering glass. The contact points between your work and the material touching it are an extremely important consideration in framing. Improper matting material will cause damage by deteriorating or discoloring the artwork. Unprocessed woodpulp is the culprit - it burns the medium, causing browning and or brittleness. For this reason it is advisable to never mat with paper-based matboard or any other materials containing unprocessed wood-pulp. If you would like to preserve an original work or collectore print, it is best to use museum standard 100% conservation matting materials and framing technique. Conservation matting materials are acid free and can be removed from artwork without trace or damage.

#### FRAMING:

Should I use metal or wood moulding for my frame? This is an area in which your framer has the experience to offer you helpful advice. Some considerations to keep in mind: What is the subject of the artwork? Fun, serious, sentimental?

What is the medium of the artwork? Oil, acrylic, watercolour, pastel, photographic, 3D? Where do you intend to hang it, and what are the colours in that location? Elements in a work of art may dictate a carry- over into the frame. For instance a natural may be enhanced with a distressed wood moulding: an abstract work may be complemented by a modernistic metal moulding: an a classical work may

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best be suited to a filligreed golden-coloured moulding. Conversly, opposites attract, an element of surprise may complement the work, or there may be a match between artwork and moulding based on personal taste. There are no limitations in framing, just common sense. Sometimes, taking a risk or going with the antithesis to your usual choice, and listening to your inner voice when something inexplicably seems to work. But when in doubt ask a qualified framer for assistance.

#### GLASS

Should I use regular, non-glare, or conservation glass? Non-glare glass is not always a necessity, and can in fact cause distortion to fine detail in your work. If glare is a problem, consider angling the top or bottom or your frame from the wall so that the glass does not reflect the light at the viewing level. Regular glass is suitable for most framing situations, and costs considerably less than non-glare glass. Conservation glass is treated on both sides and is usually used in museum standard framing, perticularly with collector prints and originals. It is among the most expensive of glasses used in framing. Original oil and acrylic artworks on canvas do not require glass in framing.

#### HANGING

How can I prolong the life of my artwork? Artwork is susceptible to damage from environmental conditions, even when properly framed.

HEAT: Do not hang your art in places where it is near a source of heat.

HUMIDITY: Humidity over 70% can create ideal conditions for the growth of mildew on you artwork. If you live in an area with high relative humidity use a de-humidifier or air-conditioning. Humidity under 30% can cause brittleness in you art. Avoid hanging you art on damp walls, exterior walls can sometimes be damp.

LIGHT: Direct and indirect sunlight and flourescent lighting contain ultra-violet rays which can harm certain paper, inks, and colours. Incandescent lighting or ambient lighting are the safest lighting sources to use.

POLLUTION: Tobacco smoke, cooking, wood smoke, and exterior airborne particles are just a few of the polutants that can damage your artwork. Ensure your artworks are well sealed in their frames to reduce pollutant damage.
