HIGHLIGHTS OF THE APRIL 21, 1998 BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

It was moved and approved that Steve Laszcz, Jeane Duffey, and Sue McIvor be reappointed for a further year term respectively as Newsmagazine Editor, Standard Committee Chair and Director at Large.

Standard Committee's Report: leane advised that her committee for the Millennium Show is made up of Sue McIvor, Donna Baspaly, Maggie White, Cathy Swift and Pat Peacock. She spoke of customs regulation and GST problems. We might have to hire a customs broker and possibly post a bond which would be expensive. Possibly we could hire an agent to do this job on a contract basis. Jeane is hoping to attract high profile jurors, adding credibility to the project, and to raise enough funding to offer at least one major award. The Committee feels that we should invite various international associations and some well known artists. The Board decided to get some more clarifications before proceeding. Meanwhile Susan Foster will contact CMHC and find out if there is any possibility of renting a larger space in close proximity to the Gallery for that time.

Business Manager's Report: Susan discussed the March 26th charity casino, the problems finding enough volunteers and the need to organise it better. From this past casino the FCA recieved \$20,000.00 for a total of \$37,000.00 this year.

Jeane reported that a former AFCA member who had allowed his membership to lapse wanted to know if he could rejoin as an AFCA. All on the Board said that this is against the policy and decided to put the official policy on this matter into the form of the following motion:

"That if an Active member has not paid dues for a period of two years or more he must reapply for Active status, and if a signature member has not paid dues for a period of two years or more he must



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PHONE (604) 576-9121 FAX (604) 576-2890 resubmit his paintings to obtain signature status, but does not need a new list of eight juried shows." The motion was carried.

Gallery Manager's Report: The paintings from the Trinity Western University and Calgary Shows will be back by the end of the week. There has been an investigation about three non-juried paintings that were presented to be hung in a juried show. In the end, it was clear that all happened due to misunderstandings and not an attempt to cheat the system. From now on a large purple line at the end of the gallery control sheet will prevent this kind of mistake.

Second Vice-President's Report - Chapters: Alessandra began by detailing her trip to the Signature Show in Calgary and her visit with the Calgary Chapter. She said the show was excellent and displayed in a very nice gallery. Reportedly, it raised a lot of interest and several sales. In the evening the gallery generously hosted a slide show, when Alessandra presented to a group of members the slides of the "Success! Exhibition" as well as some of her own slides showing her progress over the last sixteen years of painting. A discussion followed with many questions and answers, information, suggestions and recommendations. The evening ended in a warm atmosphere of friendship and satisfaction. Alessandra expressed her thanks to all the Calgary Chapter members who came to the meeting, and especially Sharon Williams for her organization and her relentless and generous help.

Sharon reported their concern about the cost of sending paintings for signature jurying. The Board decided that distant members can ship paintings unframed, but must be matted and shrink-wrapped. If they are accepted to signature status they can send the frames or the FCA can arrange for framing at the artist's cost. We will have at least two weeks space between jurying and the Success! Exibition to allow for this. Calgary also requested that from time to time we send them the accepted slides from juried shows, to see their quality. The

Board agreed this would be a good idea.

Bob went on reporting on his discussion with the Moncton Art Society. They are a 60 year old society and would like to form a sort of liason with a national organization. Bob sent them some information and the suggestion of having some of their members join the FCA, hopefully enough to form a chapter.

Bob also reported that some members from outside Vancouver are resentful for having to pay dues to support the gallery. To this end he and Susan did a cost analysis based on the 1998 budget, which showed that the Gallery is self supporting to the tune of \$3000. Membership dues go mainly toward producing the magazine and administration.

The Board also decided that it was time to set up a schedule of visits to Chapters by members of the Executive. Susan will write to the Chapters for info in order to arrange the times and optional activities. Bob brought to discussion the jurying of shows out of Vancouver, that count for signature status. There are two main concerns. One is on reaching the same artistic standards we have in Vancouver, without the same large number of entries. The other is how to maintain control over the actually accepted paintings. We must receive the list of jurors and accepted paintings of all the qualifying shows, and communicate with our signature members about how to jury these shows, in order to maintain tha same standards everywhere.

Newsmagazine: It was decided that the first mag of the year will be a colour issue using images from the Medal Show.

Other Business: Sue McIvor reported that award money continues to come in. We have some new potential donors.

Susan reported that Ellen Poole has been working on the FCA Archives and the information was compiled into two large binders that she showed us. Wonderful! Thanks Ellen.



DECLINED ARTWORK: Should your work be declined, the slide(s) will be returned to you with your receipt in your stamped self-address envelope.

EXHIBITION REGULATIONS: Artwork must be matted in predominantly neutral colours, framed and wired ready for hanging. The wire must be taught and not be less than 4-1/2" down from the centre-top of the frame. Glass with clips not acceptable.

Not-For-Sale Paintings and work that has previously hung at this Gallery in a juried show will not be accepted.

The FCA will take the utmost care in handing work submitted but cannot accept responsibility for loss or damage. Insurance is the responsibility of the artist.






Donna Baspaly, SFCA revealed her skill as an artist and instuctor at the April Painters-in-Action demonstration.



If accepted, your original painting(s) is due in the Gallery Friday, October 2nd, 1998, by 4:00 pm. The FCA reserves the right to keep slides of accepted paintings for its permanent collection.

DECLINED ARTWORK: Should your work be declined, the slide(s) will be returned to you with your receipt in your stamped self-address envelope.

EXHIBITION REGULATIONS: Artwork must be matted in predominantly neutral colours, framed and wired ready for hanging. The wire must be taught and not be less than 4-1/2" down from the centre-top of the frame. Glass with clips not acceptable.

Not-For-Sale Paintings and work that has previously hung at this Gallery in a juried show will not be accepted.

The FCA will take the utmost care in handing work submitted but cannot accept responsibility for loss or damage. Insurance is the responsibility of the artist.

A 35% commission will be deducted from the selling price. Please advise the Gallery if you are GST registered.

CONSERVATION FRAMING By Brittani Faulkes

Conservation framing refers to materials used in order to handle and preserve an artwork in a manner that will afford longevity for the artwork being framed. Conservation materials are used to counter or slow down the effects of damaging circumstances brought about by weather (cold, hot, dry, damp) and its damaging outcome (brittleness, mildew); insects (appetite and carcasses!); pollution (airborne, via smoking, cooking, dust, transient industrial); light (ultraviolet via sunshine and artificial sources); and human error (incorrect framing product selection).

Whether you are framing your own work or are having your work framed by a professional, it is wise to know whether your work is being framed for the short or the long term. What do you want for your artwork? Is it of sentimental value? Is it a signed original? Is it flat or three dimensional? Is conservation framing a necessity?

Let's start with what not to use in conservation framing, and why. Never use anything that cannot be removed. This would include masking tape, pressure sensitive tape, or gummed tape; contact or rubber cement; spray or liquid synthetic glues. Never use acid-based products containing wood cellulose which would come into contact with the

artwork, such as cardboard, paper-fibre matboard, or backing paper - these will yellow and eventually destroy your artwork.

What should you use? Products that can be removed from your framed artwork without leaving any residue behind, that contain no acid, that prevent intrusive pollutants and moisture, and that filter out destructive ultraviolet light. There are products made for every framing problem. Conservation tapes used in framing can be rolled off the artwork or backing under the finger, or can be dissolved and removed after the application of a heat source. Ideally, these tapes do not lift or remove material from the artwork. Mats, foamcore, and backing should be acid free that is, cotton, linen, mulberry, and other non-acidic and natural products - not wood cellulose-based materials. Glass is available in a number of forms, but the three basic types used in framing are regular (no ultraviolet coating), non-glare (ultraviolet coating on one side), and conservation or museum-grade (ultraviolet coating on both sides of the glass).

What are the cons of conservation framing? Cost and clarity. Conservation mats, backing, and glass can be significantly more than the cost of regular, non-conservation products. The tradeoff with conservation glass is clarity. Non-glare and conservation glass cause distortion in an artwork's fine detail. If you are unsure of your needs, ask your framer, who can demonstrate visual clarity by placing samples of glass against your work.

Next issue, everything you wanted to know about mats but were afraid to ask. White core, black core, brite core, coloured core; regular, conservation;

dozens of whites (or, what is white?); textured, marbled, linen, suede; linen liners, material wrapping; one, two, or three, and why?; and how do I choose mat colours?


