

#### HIGHLIGHTS OF THE JUNE 16TH & IULY 17TH BOARD MEETINGS

The Treasure's Reports show that for the six months ending June 30, 1998 total revenue exceeds budget by \$2000 and end total expenditures are \$8000 under budget.

The Gallery Manager's Reports show that visitors to the Gallery are down in both June and July from last year and that there has been a disquieting decline in painting sales in the last month. Hopefully this will turn around in August. Nancy presented the request of several members that the decision not to allow oneperson shows be revisited. The Board decided that solo exhibitions will be limited to very special occasions, mainly to honor, with a retrospective, the senior members who have served the FCA for a long time.

lanice, First Vice President, reported that most of the courses in the Foundation program are filling well. Only the evening course 211 might eventually be canceled.

Bob, Second Vice President, and Janice agreed to try and visit the Central and North Okanagan Chapters as well as the Victoria and Nanaimo Chapters in the coming fall.

Susan, Business Manager, reported in the absence of Standards Member, Jeane Duffey. She advised that Jeane had donated 18 sterling silver FCA logo lapel pins for juried show prizes, and showed one of them. leane specified that she does not want her name attached to the prize. A copy of the appraisal in the of \$210 from the silversmith is attached to the minutes. The Directors, to say the least, were overwhelmed by this show of generosity. Thank you so much, Jeane. Susan also presented Jeane's request for the Board to consider accepting sculptures along with paintings into a rental show. After a lengthy discussion, the Board agreed in principal to this idea, as long as the artists provide their own stands which must be approved by the gallery, and take full responsibility for breakage, theft, damages, etc. It is assumed that application for such a show would be made in the normal way through the Standard Committee.

The International Exhibition Committee is exploring the direction, the possibilities and all the aspects of this challenging initiative. They should be able to present their results by the end of this year.

The Board also discussed the proposal of reviving the Saltspring Island Seminar for the Millennium. Bob Rennie will look into the matter and at the next Board meeting will present a detailed project for discussion.

The next meeting will be September 9, 1998 at 5 pm.



#### COVER IMAGE by Brittani Faulkes

"Home Run" represents over 200 hours, or 40 days of 5-hour work sessions, of stippling with acrylic ink and technical pens. Usually I work in layers from the lightest colours to the darkest, but in "Home Run", I worked from dark to light. There are over 30 individual colours in this work, but when you add up the juxtapositions of colours in pointilism, there are probably hundreds of colours playing to the eye. The image arises from childhood memories of my fisheries-biologist father taking me to the Qualicum Hatchery to view the spawning salmon.



# ARTISTS ON THE INTERNET Get On the Net With Care


A few months ago, Opus, in their news magazine ran an article about difficulties some artists have encountered with putting their work on the Internet. A site that operates from Vancouver Island was used to illustrate problems some artists have encountered getting and controlling changes to their art site. It would be unfortunate if the problems with that particular site were expanded to artists in general on the Internet.

The problems illustrated in the Opus article were real, but they should not be seen as reasons in themselves for artists not venturing on the Internet. The main issues raised in the article related to the cost of web site, the frequency of sales from art on the Internet and the ability to make changes to one's web site once it is up.

The increase in artists on the Internet is amazing. The shear increase in numbers attests to the popularity of the medium. Yes, it is possible to spend too much money getting a web page on the Internet. No, its unlikely you are going to sell out of all your work via a web site. But there are rewards for an artist being on the Internet.

The Internet provides a level of exposure to the work of an artists that before now was never available. Never has an individual artist had the potential to have his or her work seen by viewers around the world at relatively little cost.

The FCA's site, for example, has visitors from many different countries. The following list shows the electronic imprints of countries, in descending order of frequency, visiting the FCA Web Site during the last three months alone. Some of the members on the FCA's site have reported sales that have resulted from persons looking and gaining an interest their work.

FCA Members have two options of using the FCA's Web Site. There are two studios showing the work of SFCA, AFCA and Active members. Studio One includes sites designed and placed on the FCA's file server; while Studio Two has an index that links to a member's own page on the Internet. There is a \$175 charge to have the studio designed and placed on the FCA's server. This includes the scanning of four photos or slides, creating final graphic files and preparing the page itself. There is no charge for those who want to design their own site and have it linked.

Unlike some privately operated artists-web sites, the are no commissions on sales, and for members in Studio One, where the page sits on the FCA's file server, the package includes up to six page revisions and changes are made as requested within a quick turn around time. The FCA's Webmaster can design your site, have it reside on the FCA's file server or the site can be transferred to your own Internet Service Provider.

#### HE'S GOT RHYTHM by Pat Lowes

Richard McDiarmid, SFCA, artist, teacher, karate expert, and engineer is a man with many diverse interests.

We can see that he is both "a thinker and a doer." Rick conveys these special qualities in the way he organizes his work. Before he begins to paint, thumb-nail sketches, tonal studies and colour are decided.

While he is painting Rick employs strong contrasts in:

- 1. Light versus dark values
- 2. Warm versus cool colours
- 3. Neutral versus intense colours
- 4. Transparent versus opaque colours
- 5. Large shapes versus small shapes

Rick unifies and harmonizes these contrasts at various stages of the painting process by looking for a rhythm of dark and light and linking them together with glazes. This process, according to Rick, determines the appearance of an artist's work.

Rick aptly demonstrated this for us using a street scene in Vancouver's Chinatown. McDiarmid was an absolute joy to hear and to watch. (see below)


Dear Federation Members,

The Federation of Canadian Artists sends sincere and warm condolences to Rose Zivot, SFCA who recently lost her husband.


Sam Black, SFCA, RCA, RSW, CSPW – Long time member of the Federation of Canadian Artists and one of its early board members, Same Black, died in April 1998. He became an SFCA in 1979 and was made an Honorary life member in 1997.

Sam was born in Scotland and studied in France and Belgium. He met his wife, Betty, during the war. Sam and Betty had four daughters. Bowen Island, BC eventually became their home where they also operated the Shieling Gallery.

Watercolours, acrylics and oils were the mediums Sam used in his paintings. He was also known for his woodcuts and lithographs. Sam's interest in the sea and coastal life forms are reflected in his work. The painting "Gateway to the World" was chosen to be reproduced as part of the EXPO 86 print collection.


Sam was noted for his sense of humour and his generosity in sharing his knowledge. Works by Sam Black are in many permanent and private collections in various parts of the world. Sam also received many awards, too numerous to print. He was made a Professor Emeritus of Art Education and Fine Art at UBC, where he had been a professor for twenty years. Sam was elected to the Royal Scottish Society of Painters in Watercolour (RSW) in 1953, The Canadian Society of Painters in Watercolour (CSPW) in 1963, (he won the top prize in the CSPW three times, which is as many prizes as you are permitted to receive), Print and Drawing Council of Canada in 1964, and the Royal Canadian Academy of Arts (RCA) in 1977. The West Vancouver Sketch Club established an annual Sam Black scholarship at UBC.

The Federation is honored to have been home to such a remarkable person and artist. Our sincere condolences go out to Sam's family and friends.




