SFCA: THE NEW INITIALS FOR THE SENIOR MEMBERS SIGNATURE By Alessandra Bitelli

The Senior Members' signature initials have been under discussion in recent years.

For a long time we have used the initials FCA to identify a member who has reached senior signature status. However we have never owned the rights to this trademark. We have learned recently that those rights are protected by provincial statute in every province by the Chartered Accountants Society (FCA, Fellow Chartered Accountant). I understand that some of our senior members have run into trouble when using FCA initials in Ontario.

The Board of Executives, upon legal advice, decided that we must have a designation that we can register as our own, that we can proudly use anywhere in Canada, and that can be legally protected from being abused.

After lengthy discussions and suggestions from the senior members on the Board, the Board of Executives agreed on the initials SFCA, "Senior (member) Federation of Canadian Artists". This is a natural progression from AFCA, "Associate (member) Federation of Canadian Artists". Upon confirmation from our trademark registration company in Ottawa that the initials SFCA are available, we are now proceeding with the registration, while the senior members, in good standing, can immediately start using the new initials.

SFCA, the new nationally registered and protected signature initials, represents a step ahead in the development and growth of the Federation of Canadian Artists. It is an important improvement that was achieved through the helpful cooperation of Susan Foster, our Business Manager, who worked at it with professional expertise and personal enthusiasm. Thank you, Susan.





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GALLERY MANAGER'S REPORT By Nancy Clayton

They say (some of them do) that through our paintings we express bits of our inner selves...Last evening a just-completed painting received the title "Blue Earred Critter of a Disgruntled Nature" ...(You'd tell me wouldn't you?...)

Well, after ample rainfall (rainiest 10-month period on record according to a recent CBC report) I commented on the heat in late July early August... "Just observing," I was quick to add, "NOT complaining!" But REALLY these clear blue skies are rather plain. Personally I prefer a changing mixture of tinted cloud and blue sky.

Our postcard of Julieann McGuinness' "Strolling Gastown" continues to sell and many visitors ask also if we have additional postcards available...(The theme for 1998's Postcard Picture Show is "from BC waters".)

As this goes to press the Victoria Chapter Bi-Annual Juried Show is hanging in the gallery. Part One of the Summer Gallery has come and gone and Part Two will go up soon.

COMOX VALLEY CHAPTER NEWS By Hans C. Larsen







FCA National and BC Region

Business Management:

FCA National and BC Region

Initials Research:

Susan reported the our trademark company in Ottawa confirmed availability of the initials SFCA Senior members will be receiving a letter advising them of the change. See the Article in this issue.

Executive Officers and Committees' Duties:

Alessandra felt that a description and clarification of the basic duties and obligations of the Executiv was needed. The following resolution was carried "Be it resolved that the Directors and the Executive Committees of the FCA, when acting in their capacity as official representatives of the Federation, can take initiatives and express public statements only in accordence with specific resolutions decisions, directions, or policies of the Board of the Federation. Further, Directors and Executive must seek Board approval prior to implementation of any undertaking on behalf of the Federation."

Chapters:

Alessandra asked the Board for clarification of what Chapters are and how they should be formed and structured. After considerable discussion it was moved and carried that all NEV FCA Chapters must be formed by a minimum of twenty. Active status members of the Federation and that the Board will clarify policy as to the operational rules of the Chapters as soon a possible. Alessandra, Janice and Bob will draft a outline of the above policy for Board approval.

By-Laws Revision:

Janice is also organizing a two-day workshop on Managing and Marketing Art in November. Details will be given in a future issue of the Newsmagazine.



MEMBERS... RENT THE FCA GALLERY IN 1988 DEADLINE: TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 30, 1997

Planning the 1998 Exhibition Calendar for the Federation of Canadian Artists Gallery will take place in November, 1997. We would like to show work of AS MANY MEMBERS AS POSSIBLE and it is always soon enough to prepare to enter. If you have ten slides of your recent work label them and make a list and send them in. The rest of the planning and the coordination can happen later.

HERE'S HOW:

1. Choose 10 slides that represent your recent work. These slides do not need to be of work you want to show in the gallery - they simply must be REPRESENTA-



TIVE of your RECENT work. NOTE: If you have applied for a rental slot in the gallery before and have been declined do not submit the same slides.

- Label each slide according to the example shown below. Un-labelled slides will not be juried.
- 3. Make a list of your slides. Include your name, phone number, the title, image size, medium and price. Indicate on this list any preference you may have as to when and with whom you would like to exhibit. If you have no preference that's okay.
- Prepare a self-addressed stamped envelope large enough to hold your entry – slides et al – so we can return them promptly after the Standards Committee jurying.

 By Tuesday, September 30, 1997 send or bring in the list, the labelled slides and the self-addressed stamped envelope to the Federation Gallery, ATTENTION: Standards Committee Rentals.

The Standards Committee will meet in October to review the slide entries. You will be notified in writing of the results by October 31, 1997. Please do not call the gallery for the results.

Note: After the Standards Committee has made their selections we will plan with the accepted artists re: space available, number and sizes of paintings and the grouping of accepted artists in each rental slot.

The basic rent for the two-week rental slot is \$400.00 + \$28.00 GST = \$428.00 for the whole gallery and this is shared by the exhibiting group. The Gallery will receive 35% commission on all sales. If the commission payment on total sales during a group show in the gallery exceeds the amount of the total rent paid the Federation will return that rent. This rent return will be via one cheque payable to the group representative. The Federation will not pay any costs incurred by artists for an opening reception. Submit your slides first, though, and we will fine-tune the details about dates and groupings after the selections.

Now is the time for FCA members to consider whether they would like to apply for Signature Status (AFCA or SFCA) in 1998. Applications must be in by the end of February, 1998. There has been confusion in the past about who is eligible to apply. The rules are as follows:

- Applicants must have a minimum af Active status and be a fully paid up member in good standing.
- Applicants must have been accepted in 8 major juried shows in the past 4 years and must provide names, dates and locations of these shows.
- Major shows would be National Shows such as NWS, AWS, CSPW etc., any show juried through the Federation Gallery and any Chapter show juried by 2 SFCAs and 1 AFCA.

Please be aware that meeting the qualifications to apply for signature status does not automatically guarantee acceptance. For example, last year there were 30 applicants of which 10 were successful.

TEN DAYS IN TUSCANY

A few weeks ago one of my life-time dreams came true. Although I'm not much of a traveller, I have always wanted to see Italy, Tuscany in particular. I have always had a fondness for things Italian: the food, the wine, the architecture, the gardens, and, of course, the shoes!

Often, when life-time dreams come true, the reality doesn't quite measure up to the imagination and this was my fear when Alan and I would be escorting a group of art students to "Il Mulin de Rancone" in Camporgiano, a small village near Lucca, in Tuscany. As it turned out, I needn't have worried. Despite less than perfect weather for the first few days, the trip surpassed all of my expectations, and I literally fell in love with the place.

The trip was structured in such a way that "Il Mulin" was our home base and we went on day trips from there. Il Mulin is a large farm/resort in the countryside, about a ten-minute walk from the medieval village of Camporgiano and about one hour by train from the city of Lucca. The setting for the farm is beautiful on the edge of a medium sized river that runs through a lush valley dotted with clusters of ancient stone buildings. The river was full of trout and most days there was fisherman to be seen on the riverbank, filling up his basket. There were twelve horses on the farm and numerous riding trails that wove through the forest. I enjoyed many walks through the trails and along the river, taking photos of the kind of subject matter that I can't resist for my paintings.

Most of our meals were taken at the farm, which has full restaurant facilities. We had our own dining room, as there were 17 of us eating together. All the food was made in the farm kitchens from scratch and much of it was grown right on the farm. The food was delicious and my only complaint was there was too much! But I did

console myself with copious amounts of wine.

It would take too long to tell you about all of our experiences on the trip but some of my favorit memories would be: the sound of the church beinging evey hour, the terraced hills of grapevin and olive groves, the ancient sculptural details of the buildings, the fireflies lighting our way ever night from the restaurant to our room, the lemotrees in terra cotta pots, the tiny tidy gardens if the village and, of course, the timeless beauty of the great city of Florence, and the charm of the walled city of Lucca.

Something that I did while I was there that reall enhanced the experience was keeping a journal. used a small sketch book and filled it with quic drawings and written notes of each day activities. I must give credit for this idea to m sister, Suzanne, whose journals of her travels ar little pieces of art unto themselves.

I've been home for about a week and a half as write this and I've just finished painting the first of what will surely be many Italian paintings (it is of the fountain in Sienna). Unfortunatly the pressure and obligations of real life have settled firmly bacupon me and how I long for that little slice of time when my only responsibility was to show up of time for meals. We'll just have to go back and have in fact already planned to return in September 98.

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
