DIRECTOR'S COMMUNIQUÉ



It is with enthusiasm that I am introducing our newest service that is free to members. Art sales have been a focus for the Federation staff for a few years now. For decades we've operated our own gallery, exhibiting the artwork of Canadian artists and selling what we can. But in 2018 we hired full-time sales staff and began in earnest to operate more commercially; actively

selling your work, aiding you in building your career.

In 2019, we launched FederationGallery.com, a website specifically designed for our clients, to help in our sales operations. In August of this year we completed an upgrade to the gallery site. This upgrade included general layout improvements but also included two new search features.

These new features allow staff and clients to search through our collection from past exhibitions for artwork based on their search criteria. A collector looking for a still life that includes a vase can now search for just such a painting. This is a great opportunity for our members to sell their work well after the exhibition has come to a close.

This search system necessitated a different upgrade to the existing member pages you might be familiar with including a new Member Self-Service Portal. Through this new Member Portal you can see and update your contact details, membership status, change your password and upload a biography. You'll also see a record of all the exhibitions you have entered, courses and workshops you've attended and all the past invoices we have on file. But near the bottom of the page is the underlying reason for the new portal: it features every one of your artwork images that we have on file. Here you'll be able to select all the work you'd like to list for sale.

Remember, only the work that was previously juried and accepted into an exhibition can be listed for sale. If you try to list something that wasn't accepted in a juried Federation exhibition the system will just reject the change.

If we sell your work from our website we'll cut you the same deal we did during the exhibition. We collect our 35% commission and send you your 65%. But if you sell your work on your own, just update your portal information and list your work as sold.

I encourage you to look through your portal and update your listing in the manner you would like to be represented. Also, take a look at how you and your work are now being promoted. The FederationGallery.com site has a listing of all Active and Signature members who've been juried into an FCA exhibition! This way our buyers can see more about the artist whose work they are buying. They often want to know more before they buy. This is a great opportunity to put your best foot forward.


Lesley holds a deep respect and admiration for people who choose this tough but rewarding way of life, and hopes to contribute to its preservation by eternalizing it through her artwork.






