DIRECTOR'S COMMUNIQUÉ



At the Vancouver office, we are winding up another year (didn't we just start this one?) and putting the finishing touches on the things that need some extra attention. We definitely need to make better use of our new website's sales functionality—this year's biggest change for our members. But when I look at all of this year's changes and additions, I can understand

why Federation staff can't keep up with it all, and are in need of a break this December.

Clearly COVID has taken its toll on all of us, and staff members at the Federation office, gallery and studio have been working very hard on adjusting Federation programming to somehow suit the needs of our members within the confines of our collective new reality.

The biggest changes have been to our exhibitions and education programs. While exhibitions have been available for viewing online for well over a decade, how they are viewable has had two major overhauls: now offering a searchable database, and a virtual gallery. COVID repercussions made it clear that the bricks-and-mortar gallery is no longer the only way people view your work. Gallery visitors have transitioned online and our services have grown to accommodate that. At our FederationGallery.com website, you'll find a 3-D scan of the gallery that

provides the impression of walking through our Granville Island gallery and gives the virtual visitor a much better experience.

Education is now available online in addition to in-person. All year we have hosted a full array of mentorships and workshops via Zoom. Nearly every one of our classes has seen full enrollment—including this fall's Foundations Program, now by popular demand available to everyone online! Alas, it was full before all interested students managed to find themselves a seat. So, if you want a spot next time, make sure to sign up early.

Our in-person classes are back, too, as of August. What's new is the location. We've now started using our classroom space, acquired in 2019, after it sat empty for the last 14 months. We're currently operating with low-capacity attendance to allow for social distancing, but Foundations, workshops, and classes are up and running in our very own classroom! So if you happen to be located in the Metro Vancouver area, you now have a new education centre.



RETREAT! WESTERN LANDSCAPE INSPIRES **ARTISTS**

Plein air painting at a dude ranch? It might sound a little incongruous, but the Federation of Canadian Artists chose The Flying U, the oldest continually operating ranch in Canada, for its 2021 Plein Air Retreat for good reason. Naturally set within the rolling foothills of BC's majestic Cariboo region, it allowed artists a chance to truly get away and live out romanticized fantasies of a bygone frontier—cowboy boots optional while brushing up on their painting skills. And if Western-themed artwork wasn't their style, they painted classical landscapes by day punctuated by hayrides, horseback riding, roaring campfire camaraderie, plentiful western meals served-up family-style, and even raucous saloon-worthy (karaoke) singing.

Whether resulting plein air artwork hinted at fables of lore: 100 year old log buildings, herds of galloping horses, corrals, silos and haylofts; or dispensed with dude trappings and focused on breathtaking sunsets over big skies, marshy lakeshores lined with fishing boats, and stands of colourful aspens and birches, they found it in abundance at The Flying U.

The Plein Air Retreat is the Federation's largest education and social event that offers a group of like-minded artists (40 this year) time to regroup, recharge and live in the moment in the outdoors. Days were spent gaining artistic inspiration while creating and developing skills with four master instructors: Janice Robertson, SFCA, Maria Josenhans, SFCA, Kit Bell, AFCA, and Ann Willsie, AFCA.

The ranch, which has been operating for 167 years on 60,000 acres, offered plenty of room to either work in a group or quietly alone to experience some of the most beautiful painting locations in BC. Of course, the horses were a main attraction, and often freely grazed across grasslands unencumbered by fence, allowing the artists up-close interaction.









Yet animal life also included black bear sightings, several deer and lots of birds.

For an authentic experience, accommodation featured rustic 100-year-old log cabins without central heating or running water. Executive Director, Patrick Meyer says, "I thought they were fantastic! I loved the experience of starting a wood stove to heat the cabin, and and sauna)."







Patrick reports that, according to post-event surveys, the highlights were: 1. The scenery 2. The evening activities, especially shared meals, perhaps partly because everyone misses fellowship with other artists during Covid times 3. The instructors, said to be approachable and knowledgeable educators in addition to great artists. He states, "I'm happy to report that 100% of those providing feedback said they would come again and tell friends to come—which is what I consider the test for success."

Although the Federation will travel back to The Flying U again, the themed retreat is organized to offer three varied landscapes to paint on consecutive years: ocean, mountains and foothills. Patrick concludes, "I really enjoyed offering and participating in the event, and I'm already looking forward to returning to Bamfield, BC, along Vancouver Island's rugged ocean shoreline, in 2022."


7. STEVESTON GRAND PRIX OF ART

80TH ANNIVERSARY FEATURE: KIFF HOLLAND, MASTER OF LIGHT

Kiff Holland, SFCA, is one of Vancouver's larger than life artists that forged a successful career through the decades by a keen ability to interpret, innovate and inspire. His dedication to and enthusiasm for the Federation of Canadian Artists began early in his career as an enthusiastic instructor and mentor, active President, and generous donor. His good-humoured nature offered both a childlike sense of the world and a devil-may-care attitude (often compelling him to play practical jokes) that forged his memorable character.

PAINTING

Kiff worked primarily in watercolour, and was equally known for painting BC marine settings as French countryside and intricate still lifes. Capturing the light was his greatest achievement. An intimate knowledge of the effects and power of light led to his diverse body of work. One gallery describes: "Kiff's paintings reveal his experience in using light to reveal or conceal, define or blur, excite or soothe. And it is this managing of light that make the scenery, portraits and still life objects eminently paintable." Kiff once explained, "Light reveals and defines; colour creates mood; and shadows connect and harmonize paintings."

Kiff's dedication to his craft was, at times, obsessive. **Dene Croft**, SFCA, who shared a studio with Kiff for 8 years, says, "He was a compulsive painter who painted from morning until night. His best was brilliant – and at one point, everything he made turned to gold – and his worst was bad indeed, but he was prolific and even later in his career he

completed a dozen paintings at a time sometimes as large as 48" x 72" (painting abstracts)."

BEGINNINGS

Kiff Holland was born in South Africa in 1942. Kiff's mother encouraged his childhood talent for capturing on paper the insects, butterflies and trains he loved. Ironically, due to his parent's demanding business running a children's camp, Kiff was raised primarily by African housemaids. He received formal art training in that country, but due to his disgust with Apartheid/racial discrimination, immigrated to Canada in 1975.

FEDERATION

Kiff had a deep affection for the Federation, and believed in its promotion of artists. He helped create an international presence for members in "The Exchange Show" in partnership with Britain's The Royal Institute in 1987 that had FCA artists exhibit in the prestigious London venue, and British artists including HRH Prince Charles exhibit their work in Vancouver. He regularly participated in and instructed at the FCA Salt Spring Island Plein Air Retreats that attracted over 100

eager participants from the US and Canada annually from the 1970s to early 1990s.

TEACHER

A much-loved instructor, Kiff taught for many years in the Illustration, Design, Elements & Applications (IDEA) Program at Capilano College (now University). He inspired many of today's successful artists. McDermott, SFCA states, "Kiff Holland was a great instructor and mentor in my formative years. In addition to having a larger-than-life laugh, he had a huge knowledge of technical painting and art history, and unselfishly helped many beginners. He introduced me to the FCA in the 90's which kick-started my career." Long-time friend Mike Svob, SFCA, says, "I admired Kiff's ability, willingness





and enthusiasm to share his knowledge about all aspects of artmaking and making art a profession, which not all artists are willing to do. He gave straight forward insights into everything from working with a gallery to secrets for creating better art."

Kiff regularly travelled for workshops, and particularly enjoyed teaching for fellow Capilano art instructor Paul Deggan at his centuries-old hillside home in Montaigut-le-Blanc, France. Kiff also taught throughout the US. Andrew McDermott remembers, "I have many good memories of Kiff including his fantastic group tours to NYC. Examining the Old Masters alongside Kiff's humorous storytelling made gallery visits unforgettable."


CAREER

Kiff was a long-time Signature Member of the American Watercolor Society and the Northwest Watercolor Society in addition to the Federation, and a juror for International Artist Magazine. His work won numerous awards in Canada, the US and Britain, where he exhibited with the British Institute of Painters in

Watercolour and the Royal Society of British Artists. At one time, galleries in Vancouver, Calgary, Edmonton, Toronto, Eastern and Western US, Britain and Europe regularly exhibited his work. Representation through Harrison Galleries' three locations, and his successful "Serenity Series," which sold through Canadian Art Prints, proved particularly profitable.

CHALLENGES

Mike Svob admits, "During the early 90s, several well-known artists began selling 'limited edition' watercolour prints, but printed 1,000 or more, greatly reducing the prints' actual value, yet selling them for a substantial price. Since many clients were buying them as

investments, the market collapsed, and everything 'mounted behind glass' became suspect, with work on canvas becoming the preference. This affected Kiff's career." Kiff began painting abstracts on canvas in later years, but these were not as well-accepted.

Kiff, now 79, had a long and successful career. But like the stereotype of a professional artist, art came before everything else in his life, including taking care of his health. Unfortunately, now in ill health, he is no longer able to paint. Andrew McDermott concludes, "Consider yourself blessed if you were lucky enough to be taught by Kiff or own an original Holland."


