Trained under watercolour master Lo Ku Chune and later at the Alberta College of Art, she has worked as a commercial artist and painter for over 30 years. Her impressionist-inspired works distill vibrant scenes into bold, luminous colour. A Signature Member of the FCA, Angela has served on its Board, chaired the Education Committee, and juried numerous exhibitions. Her award-winning art has been widely exhibited across Canada, including solo and group shows at the Queen's Park Gallery, Van Dop Gallery, Harrison Gallery, and the FCA.



An active member of the Federation of Canadian Artists since 2016, she was awarded SFCA status in 2020 "In Recognition of Extraordinary Achievement in the Field of the Visual Fine Arts." Her work has been featured in Artsy Shark and collected across Canada, the U.S., and as far as Australia. Marjorie continues to develop her art as a loose, painterly expression of the world she encounters.

A Signature Member of the Canadian Society of Marine Artists, Senior FCA member, and Signature member of the American Society of Marine Artists, his meticulously researched paintings are held in public and private collections worldwide, including naval museums.

Kelly Cannell is a Coast Salish artist from the Musqueam Nation in Vancouver, BC. Raised in an artistic family under the mentorship of her mother, renowned artist Susan Point, Kelly began her artistic journey at age 12. She has since become a prominent figure in contemporary Coast Salish art, working across various mediums including carving, painting, metal sculpture, silk screen printing, and glass. Her work is featured in public art installations throughout Greater Vancouver, blending traditional Coast Salish themes with innovative techniques. In 2024, she received the Polygon BC Achievement First Nations Art Award.

Leanne M. Christie's painting depicts a late summer morning on Chinatown's Main Street. Two figures walk along the sidewalk near the London Pub, while trees line the street. The soft morning light filters through the leaves, casting long shadows on the pavement. Christie uses clear, deliberate brushstrokes to capture an everyday moment in the city.

Christie's work focuses on the simple, honest details of urban life. In this piece, the quiet walk, the interplay of light and shadow, and the modest surroundings are all recorded with deliberate suggestive brushwork. The painting reflects Christie's consistent approach to capturing scenes that are deeply rooted in the lived experience of the city while also resonating with broader themes of urban transformation.

Susie Cipolla, Signature Member of the FCA since 2006, is a Canadian acrylic painter based in Western Canada. Formerly a physiotherapist, she transitioned to full-time painting in 2009. Her work spans wildlife, landscapes, and everyday scenes, and she exhibits across Canada while mentoring artists through the Whistler Out of Bounds Artist Group.

Roberta Combs, based in Pitt Meadows, B.C., is a representational painter specializing in soft pastels. 




ALLAN DUNFIELD, SFCA Silent Shores 40" x 30", acrylic on canvas, \$2600

A Signature FCA member, his work captures the region's light, mist, and natural beauty, and is held in private and corporate collections across Canada, the U.S., Europe, and Australia.







Marney-Rose Edge is a Vancouver-based artist whose work celebrates the fragile beauty of nature. Mastering watercolour, oils, and charcoal, she creates layered, textured paintings that capture the fleeting colors of landscapes, petals, and natural forms. Her subjects range from florals and nests to seascapes and animals, with the medium chosen to best express each theme. Edge is a respected teacher and juror across Canada, a Signature member of the Federation of Canadian Artists, and an elected member of the Society of Canadian Artists and the Canadian Society of Painters in Watercolour. She has been featured internationally, including on the cover of International Artist Magazine.










KEN FAULKS, SFCA Low Tide At Tower Point 8" x 10", oil on panel, \$975



Ken Faulks, a Victoria-based plein-air painter, has been exhibiting professionally since 1991 in galleries across Victoria, Edmonton, and Toronto. A Senior Member of the Federation of Canadian Artists (2018) and Elected Member of the Canadian Society of Painters in Watercolour (2022), his work celebrates the vibrancy of nature. Guided by light, colour, and immediacy, Faulks captures fleeting outdoor moments with a fresh, expressive brush.







David Goatley, SFCA, is a North American portrait painter celebrated for his Sargent-style realism. Born in London, he has completed over 300 commissions, including official portraits of Canadian Prime Ministers, Governors, and notable figures. A Signature FCA member, his work is in public, private, and corporate collections across Canada and the U.S.

Leslie Gregory Morgan, SFCA, SCA, is a Canadian visual artist renowned for her mixed-media paintings that blend realism with intuitive abstraction. Born in France and raised in London, Ontario, she earned her BFA from the University of Western Ontario. After relocating to Qualicum Beach, BC, in 2004, she transitioned to full-time painting and teaching. Her textured works, characterized by dramatic lighting and layered surfaces, have garnered numerous accolades, including awards from the Sidney Fine Art Society and the Sooke Annual Juried Fine Art Show. Morgan holds Signature status with the Federation of Canadian Artists and is an active member of the Society of Canadian Artists.



PERRY HADDOCK, SFCA *Ode to Autumn* 24" x 48", acrylic, \$3145



Perry Haddock, SFCA, is a Canadian artist from British Columbia's south coast, known for his impressionistic acrylic and watercolour paintings. Inspired by West Coast landscapes and international travels, he works en plein air and from sketches to capture mood and impression. Perry is a former arts teacher and active FCA member.

Inspired by and artistic upbringing and the spectacular natural beauty of British Columbia, Caren Heine began showing as a professional artist at the age of fourteen. Primarily painting botanical subjects in watercolour, Caren is also known for the exquisite architectural and animal subjects which she creates in watercolour, acrylic, or pastel.



In 1979 the Federation of Canadian Artists elected her to the status of AFCA., the youngest at that time to receive that honour. For the past three decades, Caren has been enthusiastically received in solo and group shows across North America, and with the Royal Society of Painters in Miniature in London, England. She has also exhibited in touring shows throughout Canada, the United States and Europe; sponsored by the Government of British Columbia, The University of British Columbia, the Federation of Canadian Artists, and the Canadian Nature Federation.

Her versatility and honed aesthetic have led Caren to apply her considerable skill to other artistic disciplines. She is a trained Interior Decorator, experienced muralist and illustrator, who has won multiple commissions from the Canadian Mint, two of which were produced as the world's purest gold coins. Caren is also a sought-after teacher for classes and workshops.

Jennifer draws inspiration from everyday alchemy, discovering beauty in unexpected or rustic settings. Her work reflects a deep love of nature and a fascination with light's transformative qualities. Raised in a family of notable BC artists, she has gained recognition from international collectors and holds elected membership with the Society of Canadian Artists, as well as Senior Member and Chair of the Federation of Canadian Artists. A passionate arts advocate, Jennifer shares her expertise through teaching and actively contributes to charitable events and organizations.

Kathy Hildebrandt is a Calgary-based, internationally recognized artist specializing in contemporary realism. Primarily working in pastel, she also creates in acrylic, oil, and watercolor. Her work often features nostalgic themes, incorporating childhood memorabilia and idiomatic expressions. Hildebrandt has received numerous accolades, including multiple awards from the Pastel 100 and exhibitions at prestigious venues like the Vose Gallery in Boston and the Salmagundi Club in New York. She holds Master Pastellist status with Pastel Artists.CA and is a Master Circle member of the International Association of Pastel Societies.

Phillipa (Phee) Hudson, SFCA, is a Zimbabwe-born artist based in Deep Cove, Vancouver Island. A lifelong mountaineer and kayaker, she captures the dramatic light and wild beauty of the Rockies, Coast Mountains, and BC's coastline. Known for bold colours and alpine scenes, her award-winning acrylics are collected worldwide.

Maria Josenhans, SFCA, is a Vancouver-based landscape painter working in oil both en plein air and in the studio. With a career spanning four decades, her work bridges realism and abstraction, shaped by her love of the outdoors. She has won multiple PleinAir Salon awards, including Best Nocturne (2024) and 1st Overall (2023). Her exhibitions include The Quality of Light (The Avenue Gallery, 2023) and group shows with the Oil Painters of America. Widely exhibited and awarded, she is celebrated for capturing light, atmosphere, and memory.

German-born Jutta, arriving in Canada in 1966, evolved from award-winning pottery to fine art painting. A Signature Member of the FCA since 1998, her abstract expressionist works--nature-inspired, experimental, and emotionally expressive--have earned numerous awards and been exhibited across Canada, featured in national and international publications.




NINA KOBA *Occupied by Silence* 24" x 36", oil on canvas, \$800



Nina Koba creates oil paintings that explore nature, emotion, and the passage of time, capturing storms, flowers, and landscapes with a contemporary style and soft abstract touches. Using bright colors and light, their mid- to large-scale works evoke impermanence, resilience, and memory, inviting viewers into reflective, emotive experiences.







William Liao, born in Beijing after the Cultural Revolution, earned a Bachelor of Fine Arts from Beijing Normal University. Initially pursuing fashion design, he transitioned to painting, blending classical Chinese and European influences. After two decades in digital art, he returned to traditional painting, focusing on landscapes, cityscapes, florals, and portraits. His work, characterized by a fusion of realism and abstraction, aims to evoke emotional resonance and reflection. Liao is represented by several galleries across Canada and the U.S., including The Avenue Gallery in Victoria, White Rock Gallery in White Rock, and Adele Campbell Fine Art in Whistler.

Brent Lynch, Vancouver-born, is a celebrated painter capturing Canada's landscapes and Mexico's vistas. Formerly a prolific illustrator, he now focuses on plein air and studio work, blending figurative elegance with landscape vitality. Exhibited internationally, his emotive paintings explore nature, movement, and human connection, held in prestigious private and public collections.

Andrew, SFCA, is an award-winning Canadian artist, past President and senior member of the Federation of Canadian Artists. Internationally recognized for his pastel and acrylic works, he has been featured in leading art magazines and earned accolades including the IAPS Eminent Pastelist Medallion (to be awarded in 2026). A sought-after instructor, he teaches across North America, sharing his expertise in drawing, painting, and composition.

Tatjana Mirkov-Popovicki is a Port Moody-based artist and 2025 MFA candidate at Emily Carr University of Art + Design. Drawing on her Serbian heritage and Canadian experiences, her paintings, mixed media, and textile works explore place, memory, and folklore. She has exhibited widely across BC and acknowledges the unceded territories where she lives and works.

Jean Pederson has been painting for over twenty years, exploring still life, landscape, abstraction, and mixed media. She has received numerous national and international awards, including the FCA Early Achievement Award, the Queen's Diamond Jubilee Medal, and Best in Show at the ISEA 2022 International Exhibition. Her work is held in the Royal Collection in Windsor, England, and she has exhibited worldwide, including China, London, Stockholm, New York, San Francisco, Mexico, and across Canada. A popular instructor, Jean has led workshops, juried exhibitions, and presented at colleges, professional organizations, and symposiums throughout North America.

Evelyn, an Exhibiting Member of the Federation of Canadian Artists, began painting in 2019 and has evolved from landscapes to abstract works. Using acrylics, pastels, coloured pencils, and mixed media, she experiments with colour, texture, and form, creating vibrant, unconventional pieces that celebrate discovery and artistic exploration.

Jan Poynter, born in Victoria, B.C., is a versatile artist specializing in painting, printmaking, and illustration. With over 32 years of teaching experience, she works in watercolor, pastel, oil, and acrylic. A founding member of the Sunshine Coast Artists Co-operative, she exhibits locally, paints en plein air, and fosters artistic engagement through workshops and festivals.

"Inspired by the spectacular lands near Lilooet BC, I painted 3 small plein air panels from this location. From a high bluff overlooking the canyon the drama of cliffs, sage and grassy slopes lead up to the dark forest in cloud shadows. That blue river such a contrast in this desert valley. The rugged cliffs were reminiscent of my recent travels to Avignon France...of castles and stone walls - soaring ramparts catching the light. What a day that was.

Layers of textured glazes, spatter & drybrush in acrylic create an organic pattern suggesting grainy slopes and distant hillside shadows."



BARRY RAFUSE, SFCA *The Tide Delivers* 36" x 36", mixed media, \$2850



Barry Rafuse, born 1940 in New Westminster, BC, is a bold mixed-media abstract painter influenced by nature. Since the 1990s, he's appeared in numerous solo and juried exhibitions--Osoyoos, Salmon Arm, Vernon, Prince George and more--and his work is held by public and corporate collections across Canada, including at the Performing Arts Centre in Vernon and the University of Northern British Columbia.

Myrtle-Anne Rempel, SFCA, NWWS, CSPWC, is an award-winning Canadian painter whose work is held in collections worldwide, including Ireland's Government House. Honoured with the Queen's Platinum Jubilee Award, she is a signature member of the FCA and an active juror, instructor, and arts advocate.

"After suffering much loss and death in my family, I decided to look for good things in my life. I love the gold in people's hearts, the sunshine that falls from the sky onto bright patterns on the flora. I love the bright colours of nature, the beautiful people in my life, the wholesome food that I enjoy and lovely classical music. I have decided to look for all the wonderful things that we can all enjoy."



JANICE ROBERTSON, SFCA *Tangled Up in Green* 30" x 30", acrylic, \$3600



Janice Robertson, SFCA, is an award-winning Canadian artist celebrated for her acrylic, watercolor, and oil paintings inspired by the West Coast. A former FCA President (1999-2001), she holds multiple signature memberships and international awards. Her work is represented in galleries across Canada and Mexico, and she is a sought-after juror and instructor.



REHA SAKAR, SFCA *Among The Forgotten Street* 35" x 25", watercolour on paper, \$950



Reha Sakar, SFCA, is a Vancouver-based watercolor artist originally from Istanbul. Known for expressive, dramatic landscapes, his work explores mood, light, and impressionistic realism. A Signature Member of the Federation of Canadian Artists, Reha also teaches workshops, sharing his expertise with aspiring artists across Canada and online.

Ralph Brian Sears specializes in hyper-realistic paintings inspired by Indigenous flora and seasonal landscapes. Trained through self-study and mentorship with David Aldrich, his work captures overlooked natural details, reflecting a lifelong passion for nature nurtured by 36 years in environmental health and a deep appreciation for the changing seasons.

KENSON SETO, SFCA Dance in the Pond 18" x 24", oil on canvas, \$2400





Kenson SETO was born in Guangzhou, China, and graduated from the Guangzhou Academy of Fine Art. He immigrated to Vancouver in 1981 as a dedicated professional artist in oil and watercolour paintings. The subject of his works, whether landscapes or human figures, comes from his own daily observation and inspiration.

In this artwork, Kenson masters the movement of water and koi as they swirl under the surface. His professional drive to master painting has driven Kenson back to the canvas since the 1960s.



MEGHAN SHARIR, AFCA Sandcastles in the Sun 20" x 20", oil, \$700



Based in Greater Vancouver, Meghan Sharir specializes in portraiture and realist painting, exploring human expression and intimate moments. Trained at UBC, Emily Carr, and through workshops with international masters, she works primarily in oil while also using watercolour and acrylic. Her work includes personal projects, landscapes with figures, and private commissions.

Gary Sim is an artist, author, and former architectural technologist. He worked on BC Rail rock gangs before a 31-year career in architecture with firms including Stantec and DGBK. His 2013 memoir Railway Rock Gang recounts his rail work. Sim's prints and drawings have been exhibited by the Burnaby Art Gallery, which also holds his works in its Permanent Collection. He founded the BC Artists project, a free online resource with 20,000+ artist entries, earning national recognition. His practice focuses on limited edition linocuts, relief prints, and drawings inspired by nature, architecture, and imagination.



ELISABETH SOMMERVILLE, SFCA *Home Range* 18" x 23", stone lithograph on paper, \$1150



Elisabeth Sommerville, SFCA, is a Canadian artist renowned for her meticulous wildlife prints, egg tempera paintings, and coloured pencil drawings. A graduate of the Alberta College of Art, she combines technical precision with a love of nature, often depicting owls and crows. Her work is held in collections worldwide, and she holds signature status with the Federation of Canadian Artists and Artists for Conservation.

Igor Staritsin, SFCA, Vancouver-based, is a classically trained artist celebrated for his evocative landscapes and imaginative realism. Blending traditional techniques with contemporary sensibilities, his paintings capture the raw beauty of nature - from rugged mountains to serene lakes - and are recognized in juried exhibitions and art publications across Canada.

Beata is a European-trained artist who creates realistic and expressive paintings, focusing on the human figure, light, and emotion. Kathleen Theriault is an award-winning contemporary abstract painter, instructor, and mentor whose career spans decades and continents. 


JACK TURPIN, SFCA Come to Rest 18" x 24", acrylic on wood, \$1400




ANN ZIELINSKI, SFCA *Kamiak* 40" x 48", acrylic on canvas, \$6450




